


































Education & Outreach Subcommittee

  - Native Plant Sale, Photo Contest, and Conservation Awards






 Ohio Environmental Education Fund (OEEF)

 Engaging teachers and students in the Oak Openings

• Dates: 10/1/2019—5/20/2021

• Extension to 5/20/2022

 Due to COVID an extension was given through May 2022



OEEF Deliverables

At least 30 teachers will be trained

→ 42 attended training

 At least 600 students will participate in the program learning the value of the OOR

• → Over 600 reached!









- OEEF Deliverables
  - HS students and up to 15 teachers will attend a field trip to the OOR
    - → 6 classrooms (142 students) attended

- · We Learned:
  - The Oak Openings still faces many challenges
    - · Amphibian and reptile decline
    - Increases in invasive species spread
    - Increases in detrimental tree diseases

Science Subcommittee 2022 Volunteer Natural Area Monitoring Highlights

Nearly 2,000 volunteer monitoring hours

Including Metroparks Toledo:

• Bat monitoring: 101.5 hrs.

Grassland Bird Survey: 167 hrs.

• Long-term Butterfly monitoring: 137.5 hrs.

Cavity Nesting Bird monitoring: 322 hrs.

• Dragonfly monitoring: 52.5 hrs.

• State-listed Plant monitoring: 316.5 hrs.

• Breeding Raptor monitoring: 585 hrs.

 11 Research Permits issued that included field research for: UT, BGSU, OSU, Toledo Zoo, McGill University, Purdue and BSBO



Science Subcommittee 2022 Volunteer Natural Area Monitoring Highlights

## **2022 Metroparks Toledo Research and Monitoring Highlights**

- 54 total raptor nests located in the Oak Openings Region
- 250 Eastern Bluebirds fledged at Oak Openings Preserve, Wildwood, and Secor
- 9 Lark Sparrow sites surveyed with 12 breeding pairs documented, 26 adult individuals documented, and 6 successful nests

## 2022 Metroparks Toledo Research and Monitoring Highlights *(continued)*

 206 Ohio Endangered, Threatened and Potentially Threatened plant populations were monitored

 30 species and 1,242 individual dragonflies documented at Wiregrass Lake

## 2022 Metroparks Toledo Research and Monitoring Highlights *(continued)*

 23 - 36 species of butterflies at 4 sites were documented

 Top 5 butterfly species found in the Oak Openings:

- Spicebush Swallowtail (512)
- Cabbage White (215)
- Great-spangled Fritillary (158)
- Viceroy (104)
- Pearl Crescent (78)

## Stewardship Subcommittee

 Chair: LaRae Sprow, Metroparks Toledo

 Shares new information and insights about non-native and invasive species and best management practices in the Oak Openings so that land managers and community members may use resources most efficiently.



 Department of Natural Areas and Preserves

 Awarded a USFWS grant for use on habitat restoration for rare species across the entire state in natural areas and preserves

> Just over \$45,000 awarded, of that, nearly \$11,000 is budgeted for NW OH; including Irwin Prairie and Campbell

 Installed bluebird nesting boxes at Campbell (4) and Irwin (10)



- The Nature Conservancy
  - US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFW)
     SMRF grant in 2022
    - TNC closed out in 2022
  - 2014 WRRSP grant
    - TNC wrapped restoration treatments and on-the-ground work in 2022
  - USFS CWMA grant
    - Extended through 2023 for more invasive plant control, additional data collection, and final model update



- The Nature Conservancy
  - Blazing Star Borer Moth grant from USFW
    - Focus was is SE Michigan with goal to restore 308 acres of habitat and plant 4000 dense blazing star plugs. Grant completed March 2022
    - Another grant was awarded to begin in 2022 to continue restoration in habitats that support Blazing Star Borer Moth. This restoration will focus primarily in Ohio



- The Nature Conservancy (continued)
  - Blazing Star Borer Moth II grant from US Fish and Wildlife Service
    - 2023 Anticipating breaking ground on this grant in the spring!
  - Save Our Great Lakes (SOGL) Grant from the US Fish and Wildlife Service, National Fish and Wildlife Foundation
    - 2023 Maintain the Gain Phase II to begin



### Metroparks Toledo

- Secor Expansion:
  - 250 acres of restoration including wet prairie, oak savanna, ditch restoration, flatwood reforestation.
- Oak Openings expansion H2Ohio wetland:
  - 48 acres of wet prairie, upland prairie, flatwood reforestation.



### Metroparks Toledo (continued)

- Cattle Grazing research at Oak Openings Preserve
- Oak Wilt Working Group developed:
  - Beginning of a statewide group to begin collaboration on growing threat of Oak Wilt in Ohio.
- Metroparks completion of SOGL:
  - "Maintain the Gain" \$64,000 sub-award.
  - TNC to complete round one of this grant in June 2023.
  - Round 2 of SOGL "Maintain the Gain" to begin in 2023.



Stewardship Subcommittee 2022 Volunteer Engagement Highlights

- Nearly 400 hours of Volunteer Hours spent working on a Adopt A Natural Area (AANA) sites!
  - 120 hours were contributed by Boy Scout Pack 27 in the Village of Ottawa Hills
- 2 New AANAs were established for 2023 in SE MI, at the native gardens of Wheeler Preserve and Ansted Park



Stewardship Subcommittee 2022 Volunteer Engagement Highlights

- 1,500+ Volunteer Hours spent on stewardship activities
- Almost 1,000 Volunteer Hours spent on Native Seed (hours in Nursery, Collecting Seed, and/or Spreading)
- 1,700+ of TOTAL Volunteer Hours spent on other volunteer activities






Stewardship Subcommittee 2022 Restoration Highlights

351 Acres treated with prescribed fire

 822 Acres treated with mowing (flat deck prairie mowing) or other maintenance mowing

 195 Acres that were planted or seeded with native plants/seed

165 New Acres acquired



Stewardship Subcommittee 2022 Restoration Highlights

- 168 Acres of other treatment
- 249 Acres of brushcutting Invasive Species
- 224 Acres of forestry mowing Invasive Species
- 2,711 Acres of herbicide treatment of Invasive Species
- 101 Acres of canopy treatment of Invasive Species
- 39 Acres of Wetland Restoration

- Growers Metroparks Toledo, GUTS, 577 Foundation, The Wild Lupine, and Bradford Blooms
- Location :
  - Blue Creek Seed Nursery White Barn
- Plant Sale Dates:
  - May 20 12 pm 4 pm
  - May 21 10 am 2 pm





- Species of Greatest Conservation Concern
- 2022 Update:
  - Filipendula rubra (Queen-of-the-Prairie)
- Maureen Bogdanski, ODNR Division of Natural Areas & Preserves

 Metroparks Toledo Blue Creek Nursery had 12 plants germinate from seed collected in 2021 from Secor Metropark, Irwin Prairie, and Blue Creek Metropark

 12 plants were added to the mixed genotype population at Blue Creek Metropark

 New population discovered on OH side of the Oak Openings; looking into contacting the owner

 Very important to continue management on remnant populations



- July 2022:
  - Letter sent to landowners, Mike and Susan Nowowiejski
    - They said yes!
- October 2022:
  - Denise Gehring volunteered to collect seed from the Nowowiejski (Mike & Susan) Residence.



- November 2022:
  - A small amount of the Nowowiejski seed was added to the Irwin Prairie population.
- 2023:
  - Mike & Susan Nowowiejski gave verbal permission for plants to be dug up from their private population in 2023
